New iPads for the Library

The library has purchased 4 new iPads allowing vision impaired library members better access to Library electronic resources.



Grant funding from the State Library of Western Australia has enabled our Library to purchase the iPads. More and more resources are available electronically but not everyone has the technology or connectivity to take advantage of this, so we hope these iPads will help fill in some of these gaps.

All Library members have free access to thousands of electronic resources through platforms such as BorrowBox, Libby, Kanopy and Hoopla, in the form of audiobooks, books, video streaming and magazines. These electronic resources can be particularly useful for people who want to listen to a book, or who want to be able to increase font size to improve readability.

The iPads will also be available for use during school holiday library activities, such as StopGo animation, removing the need for children to bring their own device in order to participate in workshops.

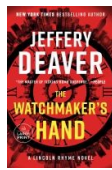

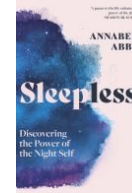

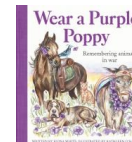
